December 9 & 10, 2011 - Uptown Express

DooWop, Rhythm and Blues, Motown! It's all on the LBP stage when Uptown Express arrives! Uptown Express is a 10-piece self-contained show featuring 5 vocalists up front to provide the heavenly harmonies of the fabulous fifties and the best of Motown styled R&B that you danced to in the 60's. Combine these vocals with a powerhouse 5-piece band of multi-instrumentalists that authentically recreate the driving dance rhythms that made the music of the era so memorable and dear to our hearts. You won't be able to stay in your seat for long. Last year's LBP performance had audience members dancing in the aisles.

February 3, 4 & 5, 2012 - Brent Burns, Gulf Shores, Alabama

You'll be wearing a 'Margarita Smile' when legendary Gulf Coast singer, songwriter and humorist Brent Burns takes the LBP stage. He was the 2008 Trop Rock Music "Entertainer of the Year." Brent also picked up awards for "CD of the Year" for his "Ragtops and Flip Flops" CD and a special WAVE award for his charitable work. 2009 had Brent recording a duet with two-time Grammy Award winner, Ray Stevens, on Brent's song, "Retired." *PS: Snowbirds are welcome to attend all performances*

February 17 & 18, 2012 - Bud Leeds Jazz Ensemble featuring Jonathan "Jazz" Russell – Bronx, NY

Violin prodigy Jonathan Russell is an exciting 16-year-old jazz violinist who bridges generational and cultural gaps with improvised jazz. He has performed in Europe and throughout the United States at clubs and jazz festivals such as the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival and the Bohém Jazz Festival in Hungary. The New York Times has written "When he solos, he embraces his instrument and enters a private cocoon, where he conjures sophisticated improvisations on the melodies of jazz standards".

March 30 & 31, 2012 - The Storytellers

The Storytellers bring the music of the late '50s and early '60s to life with stories about these songs, anecdotes about those who wrote the music and lyrics, and the place of their songs in our lives. The timeless story of Rock and Roll is told through music that has their audiences clapping to the beat, singing along, and joyfully dancing in the aisles. Matt Baker, Joe Hendricks, Janine Elise Scott, John Howard (Founder) and Johnny LaLa make each performance a wonderful memory.

If you like mysteries, you're sure to enjoy LBP's next play, Ken Ludwig's *Postmortem*, directed by Dale Moore. In a rather macabre action, William Gillette, best known for portraying Sherlock Holmes on Broadway, has invited his cast to his Connecticut castle for the first anniversary of the death of his fiancé. Did Maude commit suicide or was she murdered? Gillette suspects murder, and the game is afoot. A medium has been invited to hold a séance, in hopes of contacting Maude and learning the truth. Further complicating matters, an attempt is made on Gillette's life. Gillette takes on his role of Sherlock Holmes in real life to solve the year-old mystery and save his life.

Dale Moore has chosen some talented, seasoned LBP actors to bring this mystery to life. The cast of players includes Steve Horowitz as Gillette, Monica McIntire as May (the new ingénue in his play), Lee Lawler as his Aunt Lilly, Maureen Young as his sister Marion, Richard Blanchard as Leo (Marion's husband) and John Wyczlinski as Bobby (young playboy and hopeful suitor of May). Lisa Pindara makes her LBP debut as Louise, Maude's former roommate --turned medium.

Ethel Merman was right - "There's No Business Like Show Business". What more proof do we need than the exciting story of our own Lemon Bay Playhouse!

From a courageous but shaky first season through a restructuring and rescue in season two, to a bright pattern of continuous growth, we can now celebrate our twenty-fifth season with justifiable pride.

That big moment in season two, when the young playhouse opened its doors and said, "Welcome, new volunteer workers!" was, indeed, a turning point.

An enthusiastic "can-do" spirit of problem solving quickly developed and gave dear little LBP the morale boost it needed to persevere. Daring to select widely known but challenging plays, and then doing them well was an uplifting experience. The collaborative nature of theatre productions drew all of our devoted participants closer and transformed us into a strong, harmonious unit, a family.

As the seasons went by, our reputation spread. More actors from an expanding area began showing up for auditions. More people offered to work backstage, help with publicity, or just pitch in with whatever needed doing.

Volunteers with business backgrounds introduced marketing techniques to help swell attendance (a critical need), and these techniques worked. Others put us on a sound regimen of fiscal management. By the middle of our third season our bottom line turned from red to black!

By season five, we had to add more seats to the auditorium. By season six, we added even more - this time up to the limit allowed by the Fire Marshall. Soon, full houses became routine.

As season seven approached, there was no longer any doubt - the Lemon Bay Playhouse was a vibrant, successful theatrical enterprise. Our terrific gang of dedicated "show people" could confidently look to the future and sing out, "Let's go on with the show!"


