SPOTLIGHT ON OUR VOLUNTEERS



Did you miss seeing Steve sitting in the dark corner of theatre for the last three shows at LBP or our Showcase Productions? Meet **Steve De Dominici**, one of our lighting/sound techs.

A native of Boston and retired from the Transit Authority, this former snowbird is now a full

time resident of Englewood and has rapidly become someone to depend on here at LBP. He is a man used to change, as evidenced by his former jobs at the TA (bus & streetcar driver, Real Estate Acquisition Dept., Contract Administration for Design & Construction). This is a useful trait when you're involved with the technical department here.

He admits that he didn't like retirement at only 55 yrs old. "The loss of structure was not pleasant, I found myself at a loss looking for things to do". Having been an extra in a few movies up North, Steve thought the theatre looked like it could be fun. Fun it is, but he is in also in an area that is an extremely important part of any production, and Steve values that.

Along with tech veterans Bob LaSalle and Ann Shaughnessy, Steve gets it... "Lighting and sound is an integral part of the play, and the actors depend on us. I feel like the cymbals player in an orchestra. I sit and sit, and then suddenly, I have to play at just the right moment." He does admit that it can be a little nerve-wracking sometimes.

His other interests include the beach, the gym, traveling, and sports. He has also done stained glass and shared a secret new hobby...he's teaching himself to play a ukulele. While his immediate plans are to stay in his corner, Steve admits with a smile, "I might tryout for a small part sometime".
