

### "Chapter Two"

LBP's second show of the season is the delightful romantic comedy, Chapter Two, written by Neil Simon and directed by Rita Corn. This is a semi-autobiographical tale based on the second chapter in Neil Simon's life.

Simon's character is George Schneider, a writer and recent widower, who is having a difficult time dealing with his loss. His brother Leo tries to get George into the dating scene, but his matches are disasters. Then George meets Jennie, who is recovering from a recent divorce. What a perfect find! George and Jennie stumble on, overcoming initial hesitation and emotional neediness. Meanwhile, in a farcical subplot, Leo and Jennie's best friend Faye are having a fling.

Director Corn has chosen a talented cast for this play. Bob LaSalle plays George and Wil Horton is his brother Leo. Becky Moran, a very experienced actress new to LBP, fills the role of Jennie. Michelle Neitzel, an LBP favorite, performs as Faye.

#### Spotlight on our Volunteers



The perfect stage crew team! That's how Neal and Eunice Schattauer were described recently. How did this come about? The Schattauers originally learned about the Playhouse from friends at church and through reading

the newspapers. That was 10 years ago, when they first started attending and enjoying the plays at LBP. Eunice convinced Neal that they should volunteer as house managers about 3 years ago. After seeing what goes on behind the scenes, Neal became interested in working backstage. This terrific idea has resulted in his working backstage for the last 7 plays, and being the stage manager for "Painting Churches". Eunice has also joined the stage crew and was the prop master for "Painting Churches". Neal and Eunice say that they enjoy the friendly people they meet at LBP. "Folks make you feel welcome here."

Neal was born in Pittsburgh, PA, but raised in Des Moines, Iowa. Eunice was born in Wisconsin and lived there until after high school graduation. She moved to lowa, where she attended nursing school in Des Moines and subsequently met Neal on a blind date. Two weeks later Neal was in the army, and their courtship continued by mail. They married in 1955 and raised 3 sons and a daughter.

Neal worked for AT&T for most of his career, and Eunice was a nurse and homemaker. AT&T transferred Neal to Orlando, and he and Eunice started a bed and breakfast, which they ran for 10 years before he retired. In 1988, he started his own business doing home repair and woodworking. This kept him

quite busy until he and Eunice decided to move south. They had vacationed in Englewood so it seemed like an ideal place for their retirement.

Not content to sit on the sidelines, Neal and Eunice also volunteer at Faith Lutheran Church, and are both active in the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Neal's duties include patrolling 22 miles of Lemon Bay, teaching safety classes, inspecting vessels, and being a radio operator. Eunice has been the Materials and Uniforms Officer for 15 years. Neal has also been a barbershopper for 26 years. He used to sing with the Orange Blossom Chorus in Orlando. Today, he can be found on the risers harmonizing with the Lemon Bay Chord Company.

LBP is pleased to announce the new Lemon Bay Playhouse Annex located at 80 W Dearborn St, right next door to the theater. Since space for costumes, props, and furniture has been a ongoing issue for the playhouse, the Board of Trustees agreed to lease the building to alleviate the overcrowding in those areas. It will also be used for Adult Acting Classes, rehearsals, meetings, and other activities.

## Adult Acting and Script Writing Classes at LBP

Lemon Bay Playhouse will be conducting acting classes for adults starting the first week of November, with a final showcase presented by the students on Monday, January 24. A script writing class, also beginning in November, will present students' work at the February 7 meeting of the Readers Theater. The ten-session classes will meet once a week with time off for Thanksgiving and Christmas vacations.

#### Introduction to Acting

#### (for novices and newcomers to theatre)

If you have ever been interested in being on stage, but have never had the time or opportunity, now is your chance. This class is an introduction to the methods and theories of acting, including basic acting fundamentals, group cooperative acting experiences, scene and script work, theater etiquette and vocabulary, presentation of scenes, and movement and speech exercises. The Introductory Acting class will meet on Mondays from 5-7 p.m., starting November 1, and culminating in a presentation for friends and family on Monday, January 24, 2011.

#### Intermediate Acting (for those with some experience and familiarity with theatre)

If you have had some experience in theatre, acted in plays in your younger years, or have taken the basic acting class, this is the class for you. The Intermediate class will cover scene study and presentation, characable registration fee (waived for LBP members). The class size is a minimum of 6 students and a maximum of 12, so register early.

The cost of each course is \$110, plus a \$15 non-refund-
