Due to the time constraint, the number of speakers may be limited by the moderator in order to allow time for the bylaws revision discussion or the meeting may be extended at his option.



Bob La Salle spends so much time and is engaged in so many aspects of Lemon Bay Playhouse that one would assume that he is a full time paid employee. Nothing could be farther from the truth. Bob is a full time uncompensated volunteer, and his participation in every play helps anchor each of our successful productions.

Bob was born, raised, and educated in Rhode Island. After graduating from a two year community college, he enrolled at Johnson and Whales University in Providence and went on to earn a Bachelors and Masters Degree. He has been married to the lovely and talented Linda for 48 years, and they raised and educated 3 fine sons together. He spent most of his working life employed by New England Telephone (Verizon) and retired from that company in 2000, after 37 years of service. He and Linda spent a couple of years as snowbirds wintering in Florida and in 2003 moved here as permanent residents. It was as a snowbird that he met two of our other faithful volunteers, Ralph and Marion Barnes, who introduced him to Lemon Bay Playhouse.

His first job at our theater was as Stage Manager for the play *Don't Dress For Dinner*. He immediately became interested in the technical aspects of theater and began to work doing lighting and sound for our shows. However, it became apparent that he was also a fine actor when he played an important role in our production of *Veronica's Room*. Since then, he has acted in a number of our shows and has expanded his theatrical involvement by also directing several of our plays.

Bob is now completely in charge of all our lighting and sound, and he performs the job with virtuoso efficiency, jumping nimbly from job to job. He has an extensive library of music, which he uses to set the mood for many of our shows. He also serves on our Board of Trustees as Treasurer. 
