The past month has seen some changes to our facilities. The biggest is the new curtain. After the conclusion of "The Last Romance", Jim Sciarello and I hung the curtains and installed the new valance over the stage. It is my opinion that the color is perfect and adds a great touch of color to our theater.

We had an improvement at the Annex as well. The office door, which was falling apart and leaked very badly in the rain, was replaced. We had contracted with Truex Constuction for the door's replacement, and finally all of the necessary pieces came together. In addition, in response to many complaints about the locks on those doors, I took them in to a locksmith and had them repaired and better keys made.

We held our Annual Meeting on March 9th in the Green Room. I am pleased to announce that Michelle Neitzel was elected to her first term on the board. Thank you to all of you who sent in your ballots. There were no bylaws changes on the ballot this year. The financial report showed that we grossed \$137,509.00 during the last fiscal year on our productions. Most of the credit goes to all of the volunteers; actors, backstage, house managers, box office, costumes, props, and tech; who work so tirelessly to make our theater the success that it is. I wish to express my personal gratitude to everyone who has contributed to the success of LBP this past year. Our continued cooperation and working together will insure many successful years ahead.

THE 24 HOUR GIVING CHALLENGE: HELP LBP GROW AND THRIVE

The 24 Hour Giving Challenge is an exciting online fundraising event from noon on May 6 to noon on May 7. It is strictly an online event using credit cards. There will be \$440,000 in matching funds from the Patterson Foundation and \$220,000 in grant incentives available. The Foundation will match gifts from unique, new donors and increased donations from previous donors up to \$1,000 per donor. Last year LBP made \$3,500 in donations and matching funds. We hope to exceed that goal this year.

The goal of the Challenge is to inspire giving on all levels throughout the 24 hour period and to help organizations build their donor bases. Last year \$2.78 million dollars were raised. A total of 17,625 gifts were given and 45% of these gifts were \$25.00, the minimum

gift. This shows that small gifts can make a big difference. Last year 287 organizations participated and this year 407 organizations are participating.

You might ask, how does this Challenge benefit the playhouse. To answer that in simple terms, donations to the Challenge will allow LBP to:

- Keep ticket prices affordable;
- Add to the proceeds for the Capital Campaign for the Annex Fund to reduce the mortgage debt;
- Continue to fund capital improvements to our existing facilities;
- Continue to offer workshops, acting classes, and Readers Theater Outreach to the community;
- Provide scholarships to the Lemondrops Summer Theater Camp for children;
- Plan an expansion of our present facilities within the next five years.

2009 and soon became active in the Readers Theater group. The rest, as they say, is history. Most of the participants in this program have never been on stage before but are keenly interested in the theater. Rather than memorizing lines, they have the opportunity to "read" a part from a script and discuss it with fellow performers. Tying it all together is Kathy. It's not a one-person job, and she is quick to give credit to many of her co-leaders.

The group has established a very well received outreach program in which they perform short programs for various civic groups and clubs in the tri-county area. The 28 performances they provided in the past year have given LBP considerable free publicity and made many more people aware of our theater. Although they have no set charge for their efforts they gladly accept contributions and have turned over to LBP in excess of \$1,000 each of the past 3 years. The highlight of their program is a performance presented on our main stage which they call Shorts Aloud. The past several years they have "sold out" their 2 performances, and Kathy is actively lobbying for a 3rd performance.

In addition to all she does for Readers Theater, Kathy has appeared in our main stage productions of *Enchanted April* and *Dixie Swim Club*. Last November she appeared in a leading role in the Charlotte Players production of *Hallelujah Girls* directed by Ron Bupp. In her community of Holiday Lakes, she is in charge of the community kitchen and often cooks for as many as 240 residents. Thank you, Kathy, for your boundless and buoyant hard work and leadership.
