### EDUCATION FOR FUTURE THESPIANS CONTINUES IN 2016 BY JIM SCIARELLO

For the fourth year in a row, Lemon Bay Playhouse has held the Lemondrops Summer Theatre Camp for children. Again, the camp was taught by Cheryl Hastings and Patty Tuff, two of our volunteers dedicated to teaching children the methods of acting. This year, there were 20 campers, ranging in age from seven to thirteen. Many were repeat students, including a few that attended all four camps. This year, there were fourteen returning actors. This is a real tribute to the teachers and aides involved in the program. This popularity of the summer theatre education opportunity demonstrates the need for this children's education and exposure to the theatre arts.



Eleven of the campers received full or partial scholarships. Seven of the scholarships were provided by LBP and four scholarships were provided by the Royal Palm Players of Boca Grande. Lemon Bay Playhouse thanks the Royal Palm Players for supporting our mission and efforts in providing education and training in the performing arts.

The classes ran Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon. The classes started July 11<sup>th</sup> and ran for three weeks. The camp included snacks for each of the future thespians. In addition, the campers received an acting workbook, a water bottle, and a camp shirt.

The students were instructed by Cheryl and Patty. They were assisted by five volunteer camp helpers: Matthew Black, Nathan Black, Kayla Gebert, Dori Mann, and Myranda Villacis. The campers learned improvisation, characterization, blocking, puppetry, stage direction, and many more acting related activities. All of these techniques were then used in performances provided to parents and family at the end of the class. The performances were of two shows written by playwright Cheryl Hastings. The plays were *The Pin Head Brigade* and *The Nut Family Reunion*. Patty and Cheryl each directed one of the single act plays. Preview rehearsal for the summer camp students was performed for LBP volunteers on Friday, July 29 at 10am. Performances for the family and friends of campers were held on Friday, July 29th and Saturday, July 30th at 7pm. A "make your own sundae" cast party immediately followed the last performance. The families and friends of the campers were invited to the cast party.

## HELP LBP RAISE THE ROOF BY PARTICIPATING IN THE 2016 GIVING CHALLENGE BY CHARLIE TYLER



The yearly 24 Hour Giving Challenge represents an opportunity to make your donations to Lemon Bay Playhouse go further than ever. Last year, the money we raised, more than \$7,000, was used to help pay off the mortgage on the Annex, which the Playhouse now owns free and clear.

As you may already know, the Playhouse is replacing its leaky and outdated roof this summer. This project represents a major capital improvement to the theater and will cost in excess of \$40,000. To help defray the cost of the new roof, LBP will use its entire balance raised in the 2016 Giving Challenge to help underwrite this project.

If you do not know about the Giving Challenge and how it works, here is some information.

The Giving Challenge is an exciting 24-hour giving event supporting more than 450 nonprofits serving Sarasota, Manatee, Charlotte, and DeSoto counties. Since 2012, donors from throughout our region have shown their love for local nonprofit organizations by providing more than \$15 million in unrestricted funding to support their missions. Last year's event set a new standard for generosity in our community, when more than \$7 million was raised in just 24 hours to benefit 449 nonprofits listed on The Giving Partner.

The date and time period for this year's challenge are September 20 and 21 from noon to noon. During this period, people who care about causes in our community can go online and make a secure donation, helping their favorite organizations receive special matching dollars and grant incentives. The website is <u>www.thegivingpartner.org</u> and will only be open for giving during the time period specified.

This year, the Patterson Foundation will provide a 2:1 match for contributions from **new** donors – for donations up to \$100 per new donor, per organization. Additionally, it will provide a 1:1 match for contributions from **returning** donors – for donations up to \$100 per donor, per organization. In other words, if you are a new donor and give \$50.00, the Patterson Foundation will match it with \$100. Your \$50.00 donation is actually worth \$150.00. If you are a returning donor and give \$50.00, the Foundation will match it with \$50.00, making that donation worth \$100. Moreover, anonymous donors having provided \$5,000 in matching funds for all donations. Just think how meaningful your donation to LBP will be this year.

### **INTENSIVE SUMMER ADULT ACTING WORKSHOP UNDERWAY** BY LOUISE GOODWIN

This summer's Adult Acting Intensive Workshop attracted fifteen beginning and intermediate participants from ages 15 to 82.

The Intensive class included units on dealing with tension and anxiety, auditioning, moment-to-moment monologue work, character analysis, physicalization of emotion, and beginning scene work. "Having a blended workshop of both beginning and intermediate students has been incredible", notes instructor Ric Goodwin. "The beginning students are learning from watching and interacting with the more advanced students, and with this wide age range and varied life experiences the observations have been valuable to all involved." The final class on August  $6^{\text{th}}$  featured process performances of individual character monologues by the students.
