24 HOUR GIVING CHALLENGE – 2015 PLEASE SUPPORT YOUR THEATRE

Would you give money to Lemon Bay Playhouse if you knew that what you gave would be matched by the Patterson Foundation up to \$250.00 per donor? Do you know anyone else who would do this?

This year's 24 Hour Giving Challenge on **September 1 and 2** provides an opportunity for that to happen. The 24 Hour Giving Challenge is an online fundraising event, giving qualified nonprofits an opportunity to raise money for the people, animals or places they are created to serve. It is strictly an online event, using credit or debit cards. No cash or checks are accepted. The Challenge is active from noon on September 1 to noon on September 2.

For the 2015 Giving Challenge, the Patterson Foundation will provide a 1:1 match for each **new** donor's contributions - up to \$250 per donor, per organization. **This match will be good for the entire 24 hours of the Challenge.**

New donors are defined as people who did not donate online to the 2014 Giving Challenge. Are you one of these people? If you are, you are considered a new donor, regardless of whether you have donated money to the theatre by other means. It's an exciting opportunity to double the impact of your support of Lemon Bay Playhouse.

If you did not participate in Giving Challenge last year, please consider participating this year. The minimum you can give is \$25. Most of the donations to the Challenge (69%) are \$50 or less. You must donate online to qualify for matching and gifts cannot be revoked.

What if someone donates \$25 online early in the day and then decides they would like to add another \$25? That gift will be matched, too, up to a total of \$250.

Here's how to give:

Go to www.givingpartnerchallenge.org any time after noon on September 1. Do not go prior to noon. The site will not be active. Search for Lemon Bay Playhouse on the home page of www.givingpartnerchallenge.org

Make a donation with a major credit card or debit card. Each gift is 100% tax-deductible and will be applied to general operating support for Lemon Bay Playhouse.

Again, please consider giving online this year if you have not given in the past. Also consider asking your friends to give.

Your donation will allow LBP to:

- 1. Keep ticket prices affordable;
- 2. Add to the proceeds of the Annex Fund to pay off the mortgage on the Annex;
- 3. Continue to fund capital improvements to our existing facilities:
- 4. Continue to offer workshops and Readers Theater to the community:
- 5. Provide scholarships to the Lemondrops Summer Theatre Camp for Children and Lemon Bay High School;
- 6. Plan an expansion of our present facilities within the next five years.

A LEMON BAY PLAYHOUSE FIRST: EVENING ADULT ACTING WORKSHOP

Lemon Bay Playhouse, for the first time ever, has offered an evening adult acting class for beginning and intermediate actors ages 16 and up. This popular workshop filled to capacity early with 20 students meeting twice a week during the month of July. The 20 aspiring thespians learned techniques in dealing with useless tension, improvisation, theatre games, character analysis and development, auditioning practices, and moment-to-moment monologue work. Each student worked on a 1-2 minute monologue they can use in future auditions. Workshop instructor Ric Goodwin remarked he was "thrilled with the commitment and dedication of all the students." Thirteen of the 20 participants were new to LBP and say they are excited with the prospect of getting involved in future productions and participation in future acting workshops.

ADULT ACTING CLASS

Lemon Bay Playhouse will be conducting an acting class for adult students age 16 and up. The workshop instructor will be Ric Goodwin (MFA in Acting, Wayne State University), a retired professor of Theatre with over 40 years of teaching and acting experience.
