EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Some interesting things have transpired over the past two months. First, we have had a hearing aid loop system installed in our theater. All of you that have the T-coil in your hearing aids, and it is turned on, will be able to hear our productions through your hearing aids now. We also have some receivers with earphones for those of you that don't have the T-coil installed.

Second, we are going to have our roof replaced. We have been noticing several leaks appearing, one in the lobby, a second in the Green Room and a third in one of the bathrooms. I had a roofer in to inspect the roof and it was determined that the roof was too old and out of code and needed to be replaced. I solicited four bids for the work and at the May 23rd meeting of the board we decided to table the action until all board members had the opportunity to review the bids. We are hoping to procure a grant to help defray the cost of this expensive project.

Third, we are going to have the parking lot repaved and restriped. We have been noticing the beginnings of pot holes and cracks in the pavement surface and decided it was time to repave. We have applied for a grant from the Community Foundation of Sarasota County and are waiting for their reply and must wait for that before proceeding.

Have a wonderful summer and I look forward to seeing you all in the fall.

SUMMER ADULT ACTING INTENSIVE WORKSHOP

Lemon Bay Playhouse is proud to offer an Adult Acting Intensive Workshop this summer. The workshop is for beginning and intermediate students from high school age through senior adults on a first come-first served basis. Class size will be limited to 20 participants.

The workshop will be held at the theatre and will run for four successive Saturdays: July 16, 23, 30 and August 6 from 9:30am to 12:30pm. The cost of the workshop is \$50. This intensive training will include units dealing with tension/ anxiety, auditioning, moment-to-moment monologue work, character analysis, finding emotion, and beginning scene work.

Instructor for the workshop is Ric Goodwin, the Artistic Production Manager for LBP. Ric is a Professor Emeritus of Theatre from Ashland University, Ohio and holds an MFA in Acting.
