

Over the past many years Readers Theater (RT) has become one of the driving forces behind the continued success of LBP. It has opened the door to many who may have thought "I can't get up on stage". Well it turns out they most certainly can, and that has helped spawn a legion of supporters and contributors that has helped our theatre

The beloved Rita Corn, along with her husband Richard, was instrumental in getting this program started many years ago and is now in the very capable hands of our spotlight volunteer of the month Kathy Amelia.

Kathy moved to the area from Long Island, NY about 10 years ago, after spending 34 years in Law Enforcement; while earning her degree in Criminal Justice along the way. "My involvement with LBP got started after a friend and I dropped by the theatre in 2007 to attend an open house" Her first play Enchanted April, directed by Dale Moore, was mostly due to her ability to speak Italian. Along the way she also performed in Dixie Swim Club, Social Security and with the Charlotte Players in Hallelujah Girls and Cemetery Club.

Volunteer work is what Kathy is all about. In 2007 she started in the community kitchen at the Village of Holiday Lakes in Port Charlotte, a position she has been heading for the past 8 years. Along with lunch being served to up to 120 people once a week,

Kathy also does special events at the community for up to 250 people.

One of the key components to the success of LBP is not only reaching out to the community but going out into the community. There is no better example of this than Readers Theater outreach program. With a schedule that includes up to 15-20 shows per season, performing at churches, women's clubs, assisted living facilities and schools.

All of this is done at no charge to the person holding the event (donations gratefully accepted of course). Talk about promoting our theatre, talk about putting a face on our theatre, RT, with the Leadership of Kathy Amelia, has much to be proud of.

The main stage production of RT is "Shorts Aloud" which is presented as a showcase event. With six skits, along with intermittent entertainment, it is one of the highlights of our season. As a sidebar, ALL the money we receive from Shorts Aloud goes into LBP coffers.

Community Theatre is about a dedicated group of volunteers who have a love for the arts, in particular theatrical performance. The genesis of this for many can often be discovered through Readers Theater. LBP should be very proud and grateful for a volunteer like Kathy Amelia; through her many, many hours of work leading our RT group along with stage managing and acting. Thank You Kathy for helping to make LBP the Jewel on Dearborn.

PLAYHOUSE ROOF FUNDRAISER **UPDATE**

As you may remember, on September 20 and 21, Lemon Bay Playhouse participated in the \$30,000 2016 Giving Challenge for the fourth time. The objective was to raise unrestricted funds to help pay for the new roof being put on the \$10,000 playhouse at a cost of over \$40,000. The Giving Challenge raised about \$10,000 which brought us to 25% of our goal. After the Giving Challenge our campaign continued. Thanks to you, our generous friends of LBP, we have now raised over \$16,000 in donations

which is about 40% of the \$40,000 cost of the new roof that was put on the Playhouse.

Our campaign to raise the full amount is still ongoing and any further donations are deeply appreciated. 

I have been working since September with Professor Nicollette Mason from SCF to turn this idea into a reality. This is truly a win/win situation for both of our organizations. The paperwork is completed and

internship opportunities will be advertised through the Career Resource Center at SCF Venice Campus; office of Michelle Groves, Advisor. The internship will offer students the opportunity to receive academic credit for the real-life experience of working both onstage and behind the scenes at our playhouse. Because these are unpaid internships, the SCF students will be working side-by-side with our incredible group of volunteers. Students can opt for academic credit or no credit, using the experience to build their resumes.

TUESDAY WITH MORRIE TO OFFER LBP'S AUDIENCE A NEW EXPERIENCE

As a director, one of my primary obligations is to attempt to get the audience to suspend their disbelief and draw them into "the world of the play." With most of the plays you see at LBP, the directors use "realism", such as realistic settings. Plays are presented as if you are looking through a fourth wall into the setting of the play. Realistic props such as telephones that ring and radios that play, etc. are examples that directors will use as visual reinforcement in telling the story.

I have chosen to go in a different direction with Tuesdays with Morrie. I would ask you instead to focus on the two characters and the inspiring and poignant words they are sharing with you. At times they will talk directly to you; at times to each other face -to-face. And at times, incorporating a theatrical technique called offstage focus, they will project the characters they are talking to out and above you. Some props you will see; others will be pantomimed and seen with your mind's eye. Places in the play will be suggested and through the dialogue become obvious.

So I am asking you to join me on this less-is-more, minimalistic journey, as we share this beautiful story that Mitch Albom and Jeffrey Hatcher have given to us. Watch, listen, feel, laugh, and learn, for as Mitch reminds us at the end of the play, "the teaching goes on".

Thanks to the many volunteers and supporters of the arts at Lemon Bay Playhouse. Due to your participation we have accrued a tremendous amount of volunteer hours and have significantly increased our membership in 2016.

With great appreciation we can report a total 15,745 hours contributed by our 112 volunteers. These numbers equate to approximately 141 hours per volunteer. There were also 22 volunteers with more than 250 hours in 2016. I have the feeling that there may be some volunteer that have not turned in their volunteer hours card and therefore, the numbers may be a little lower than in actuality.

We also give a big thanks to our supporters of the arts who have made contributions to Lemon Bay Playhouse. Anyone who made a contribution of \$25 or more has become a member of the playhouse. Last year we had 74 members and currently we have 124 members. Due to our supporter's generosity we have an additional 50 members which equates to about a 68% increase. 
