CRIMES "Crimes of the Heart" will be directed by Ron Bupp and run from January 17 through February 11, 2018. It calls for a cast of four female and two male actors, and tells this compelling story: The three McGrath sisters are back together in their southern hometown for the first time in a decade. Lenny, the eldest,

never left Hazelhurst -- she is the caretaker of the sisters' cantankerous Old Granddaddy. Meg, the middle sister, left home to pursue stardom as a singer in Los Angeles, but has, so far, only found happiness at the bottom of a bottle. And Babe, the youngest, has just been arrested for the murder of her abusive husband. Under the scorching heat of the Mississippi Sun, past resentments bubble to the surface and each sister must come to terms with the consequences of her own " crimes of the heart."



"Fleming " will be directed by Bob LaSalle and run from March 7 through April 1, 2018. It calls for a cast of three female and four male actors. A comedy/ mystery it unfolds as follows: Bored by his privileged, but mundane life, Henry Fleming sells his lucrative brokerage firm to become a detective. On

his very first case, and to the horror of his wife, Karen, and his two crazy neighbors, Suzy and Stan, the Flemming living room begins to fill up with dead bodies. Karen is further annoyed when one of them turns out to be her father. Even though Henry keeps showing up at home every day more disheveled and beaten up, he couldn't be happier. Henry is convinced he's found his life's work and Westport, Connecticut is safer for it.

opening night are usually filled with anxiety and concerns all their own. Imagine trying to memorize those last few lines, blocking changes and timing nuances of a comedy show like *Annoyance* while going through what the rest of us were going through preparing for Irma?!

Once the theater volunteers emerged from their own homes to survey their own damages, they came to check on the theater. Thankfully, Lemon Bay Playhouse survived Irma with absolutely no physical damage! However, like most of us, it did lose power. According to Bob LaSalle, only one leg of the power input was dead, but that took out the all the air conditioners, some lights, and the computers and wi-fi. FPL was busy everywhere else, so Bob and other volunteers ran many extension cords to get the computer and phone in the box office as well as the internet router and wi-fi working. Now at least they could contact ticket holders and get the message out that the theater would be dark. LBP is very grateful to the volunteers that spent hours contacting ticket holders and answering incoming phone calls. It was tough to re-schedule people's chance to see *Annoyance* when no one was sure when power would be fully restored.

In fact, the hardest part about this situation was when partial power was restored, enough to run the A/C in the theater itself and run the theater lights, and everyone rallied and got the show on stage that night (the 14th) ... only to have the power go out again the next day! At one point, FPL came out and thought they had the electrical issues all fixed, but when Bob came in he found it hadn't worked and they had to cancel that night's show at the last minute *again*. FPL did come back and fix the problems and we have been up and running and back in business since the 21st. Two extra performances were added which helped accommodate most of our cancelled ticket holders, although we did have to process quite a few refunds.

In all, seven performances of *Annoyance* were cancelled. One of the actors commented how difficult it was to stay focused on their character work and remember all the blocking with so much else going on, (including Irma aftermath at home as well as the theater), only to have performances cancelled. It was all so very annoying! But for the rest of us theater-goers, we really appreciated being so entertained by such a hilarious comedy when we finally got to see it. Laughter was exactly what we needed after Irma and watching the cast, crew and team of volunteers rally to support the theater's mission was inspiring as well. Let's hope the rest of our theater season won't be such an *Annoyance*!
