PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



After the rocky start what with hurricane Irma and all, our second show, *Later Life*, was fairly successful coming it at 82% and I expect that our Christmas show will do as well if not better. With that in mind, I decided to take a look at

the previous four years to see what our success rate has been. Over that period, we sold a total of 39,662 tickets out of a possible 43,700. That comes out to a whopping 90.8% average sales rate over the four year period. I'd say that we are a very successful theater.

Thinking about this has made me think about what we want for the future. We have been talking about a 200 seat theater with all of the bells and whistles that go with it. To manage a theater of that size, we will have to hire a full time Artistic/Managing Director, and they don't come cheap. We will have to hire more staff and make them full time as well. People such as a Tech Director, Wardrobe/Costume manager, Business Manager, etc. The list goes on and on. This will mean a much larger operating budget and to support that we will need to raise ticket prices and have a full time fundraiser as well. The question is, can Englewood support such a theater?

The only reason we have been talking about 200 seats is so we can have a bar. But, how much does a bar bring in and will it make up for the added expenses we incur for such a large facility. My conclusions to those questions is, NO! It won't make up for the much larger budget.

My next question was, what do we really want in a new theater? Well, from all my discussions with actors, directors, and especially our patrons, I have come to this conclusion. We need a bigger stage with more modern technical equipment and more comfortable seating. This will enable us to mount many plays that we have been unable to produce up till now and make our patrons much more comfortable as well. So let's go for that instead of a bar. We have been doing just fine without one up to now, so why not continue that way.

I propose we revise our plans to a 100 to 110 seat theater with a wider and higher stage and with more modern tech equip-

ment. This will require a smaller footprint than what we have been talking about and cost less to build and maintain. We can continue to operate as we have been with maybe added staff, but not at the cost that a large theater would require.

On a more serious note, we have received resignations from three of our present board members: Charlie Tyler, Michele Strauss, and Kim Fox, all citing personal reasons for the action. It was with reluctance, but an understanding of the circumstances that the board accepted the resignations. This leaves three vacancies on our board. So we are looking for some dedicated individuals who have business acumen, an interest in theater, and willing to put in the time to continue the excellent work we have been doing. 
