

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



In the last issue of the Spotlight, I announced the purchase of a new LED sign for the front of our theater. Well, when we attempted to get the permits for the sign we were informed that the land in front of our theater is not ours, it belongs to the state. You see,

back in 1944, the state platted Dearborn St. as a four lane road (state highway 777) all the way up to McCall Rd. This means that the right-of-way for Dearborn extends right up to the sidewalk at our front door. Zoning laws don't permit a message center sign (LED) on land we don't own and they do not permit variances. So, the sign was canceled and the deposit was returned to us. I am going to pursue this with the state and see if we can get the right-of-way changed and, perhaps, buy that land back.

The only other large undertaking that is going on at this time is that we are going to replace the floor of the stage. Right now it is covered with Masonite that has about 12 layers of paint on it and it is buckled in some places and is just a mess. We are going to lay ¾ inch plywood over this, fasten and glue it down, sand it, and then prime it. The set for *Last of the Red Hot Lovers* will have a brand new floor to work with.

Hope you all had a pleasant summer and I'm looking forward to seeing everyone in September.




