Ann Foster moved to Tangerine Woods in 2004 and the place hasn't been the same since. We who were her friends and neighbors on Newbury Court watched in amazement as she flitted from activity to activity. She was rarely "home." When she was home, she was often hosting neighbors and friends in her home or carport for happy hour.

Her social life was enviable. She was involved in the Englewood Fun Chorus which entertained shut ins at our nursing facilities and similar locations. When the original chairperson of Adopt A Family, Peg Totman went to be with God, Ann took on that responsibility. She performed duties of host and usher as well as performing at Lemon Bay Playhouse. Among her other interests, she found time for bowling and shuffleboard. She played Mahjong and loved hosting movie nights. She took over the chairmanship of the library, a daunting responsibility. Additionally, she was in charge of getting name tags for the new residents. It was not all work in spite of the numerous tasks and responsibilities. Along the way, she made many friends and remembered every one of them on their special occasions. She belonged to a group that celebrated monthly birthdays at a local restaurant. As if that wasn't activity enough, her hobbies included quilting, sewing, reading, and singing at local karaoke nights. Her interests broadened as she aged and she included travel as part of her enjoyment.

Family was the most important aspect of her very busy life. She was a very proud parent. She often spoke lovingly of their accomplishments. LBP is a small, non-profit, community theatre which thrives in Englewood due to our valued patrons. The financial impact of these cancellations is estimated at approximately 24% of our gross income. This will limit the financial impact to the theatre and ensure availability of live theatre in Englewood. We will honor all obligations and process refunds if desired. No credits for next season will be offered as our goal is to keep the financial impact to the current season.
